A distinguished keynote speaker and panel will examine the issue of immigration and explore the challenges for an institution like UMDNJ, which both educates healthcare providers and delivers healthcare services to patients throughout the State. This subject is very timely as Congress prepares for what is certain to be a contentious debate on national immigration policy.



**Moderator: Maria Hinojosa (left)**, anchor and managing editor of *Latino USA* on National Public Radio and senior correspondent for *NOW* on PBS. Hinojosa has covered issues related to immigration extensively in a career as an award-winning journalist that has spanned more than 20 years.

**Keynote Speaker: Dr. Ciro Sumaya**, Professor of Health Policy and Management at the School of Rural Public Health at the Texas A&M Health Science Center, founding dean of the school and former Administrator for the Health Resources and Services Administration, the principal federal agency charged with increasing access to healthcare for those who are medically underserved.

In addition to Dr. Sumaya, the panel will include:

**Albert L. Gutierrez**, President and CEO of Shore Memorial Hospital in Somers Point, N.J., a frequent provider of healthcare for immigrant populations in southern New Jersey.

**Arlene Muñoz**, Director of Program Operations at the Spanish Community Center/Shore AHEC (Area Health Education Center) in Atlantic City, which works to enhance access to quality care in local immigrant communities.

**Dr. Cynthia Y. Paige**, Associate Professor of Family Medicine at UMDNJ-New Jersey Medical School in Newark, whose patients include many of those, especially women, impacted by issues related to their immigrant status.

**Gregory Palakow**, a partner at the law firm of Archer & Greiner in Flemington, an expert in immigration law who will address both the obligations and restrictions that healthcare providers face in treating immigrant populations.
